iNaturalist app	Record plant and animal observations to share with other naturalists and contribute to biodiversity science. Once you have the app, click on Projects and join "CWEP Regional Creek Week Biothon 2022."
Find your watershed	Visit https://www.epa.gov/waterdata/hows-my-waterway and type in your address.
Scavenger hunt	Visit DurhamCreekWeek.org and click on events to find the scavenger hunt.
Rain barrels	The City of Durham's Department of Water Management, in conjunction with Rain Water Solutions, Inc., is offering 50 gallon rain barrels at wholesale to Durham Water customers. Designed for easy assembly with linking capabilities, rain barrels are just \$73 plus tax through durhamnc.gov/1062 . Durham Soil and Water Conservation District also sells discounted 50-gallon and 65-gallon barrels; call 919-560-0558 for details.
Nature walk or visit a creek	Join one of the guided Creek Week walks or visit the interactive map at https://nc-cleanwater.com/get-outside/ for ideas on where to go.
Identify an aquatic macroinvertebrate	Turn over a rock or use a small net to see what you can find living in the creek. Be sure to return the rock and return the critters after you observe them. Aquatic macroinvertebrates such as dragonfly nymphs and caddisfly larvae are important indicators of stream health. Eno River State Park has an online resource guide to help you ID the water bugs (see pages 7-11) https://files.nc.gov/ncparks/37/eno-river-eele2.pdf .
Adopt a storm drain	Visit draindurham.org to find a storm drain near you to adopt. You agree to clear litter, leaves and debris from the top of the storm drain and nearby. This keeps litter and other pollution out of our streams.
Plant native wildflowers	Purchase seed packs from Durham County Soil and Water Conservation District and watch your yard bloom! Native wildflowers support habitat for pollinators and help water soak into the ground.
Plant a tree	Your local hub for volunteer tree planting is https://keepdurhambeautiful.org/tree-planting .
Identify a bird	Use the iNaturalist app or join a Creek Week nature walk.
Read a book	Visit our book list at DurhamCreekweek.org for ideas for all ages.
